

Three-Month Furniture Making Intensive Veterans Association Post-9/11 Benefits Explanation

Qualifying veterans may use VA benefits, including the Post 9/11 GI Bill or Veteran Readiness and Employment (VR&E) benefits, to cover the tuition for the Three-Month Furniture Making Intensive offered through the Continuing Education Department at North Bennet Street School (NBSS).

- You are required to pay the \$900 deposit to register and hold your spot. This will not be refunded if you cancel or drop the class.
 - You will be reimbursed for the \$900 deposit when NBSS receives payment for you from the VA if the payment is sufficient to cover the cost of the course in full.(usually within the first week of class).
- You are required to submit a current Certificate of Eligibility to the Continuing Education Office at least one month before the start of class.

 - Once the VA has provided you with a Certificate of Eligibility, please forward a copy of it to the Continuing Education Office.
- Once you have registered for the course and provided your Certificate of Eligibility to the Continuing Education Office, the Continuing Education Office will forward your Certificate of Eligibility to the NBSS School Certify Official (SCO). The NBSS SCO will then certify your enrollment with the VA.
- If you will be using Veteran Readiness and Employment benefits (VR&E), your VR&E counselor will contact the NBSS SCO directly to request enrollment verification.
- You are responsible for any portion of the cost that your VA benefits do not cover.
- Please be aware of our attendance policy. Students with 5 unexcused absences will be withdrawn from the course. If you are withdrawn, the VA stops paying housing benefits.
