A Guide for Students

Overview

Our team is here to help you understand your eligibility for all types of financial aid, including grants, loans, scholarships, and other educational benefits. Nearly 75% of our current students receive financial aid, and we will provide over \$1,100,000 in NBSS scholarships directly to qualified students this year.

How to Apply for Financial Aid at NBSS

To apply for financial aid at NBSS, please complete the FAFSA that corresponds to your intended start date. There is no deadline to apply, but an early FAFSA submission will help with your decision making.

- **01** | <u>Complete the FAFSA application</u>. Use NBSS code 015527.
- **02** | Estimate your costs and financial award. Our net price calculator is great for domestic or international* students.
- 03 | If a veteran, determine your VA benefits. Remember to send us your certificate of eligibility.
- 04 | <u>Review private and NBSS scholarships.</u> Your FAFSA is all you need for NBSS scholarship consideration.
- **05** | <u>Complete your Admissions requirements</u>. Once accepted, we will send your unique financial aid award package.

Types of Aid 01 Grants & Scholarships

Grants and scholarships are often called "gift aid" because they are free money—financial aid that doesn't have to be repaid. These can come from several sources: the <u>government</u>, our <u>own</u> <u>NBSS funds</u>, or from <u>private sources</u>.

Types of Aid 02 Loans

A <u>loan</u> is money you borrow and must pay back with interest. Be sure to understand who is taking out the loan—you or your parents—and what responsibilities it brings.

Student loans can come from the federal government, or from private lenders. Federal student loans generally have better terms than loans from banks or other private sources.



Types of Aid 03 VA Benefits

If you served in the U.S. military, you may be eligible for Veterans Administration education benefits, which can supplement other aid like grants and loans.

You can use <u>Post 9/11 G.I. Bill®</u>, <u>Chapter 33</u> or <u>Vocational and</u> <u>Rehabilitation Benefits</u>, <u>Chapter 31</u> towards all of our <u>Career</u> <u>Programs</u> and our <u>Three-Month Furniture Making Intensive</u>.



NBSS Scholarships

In addition to federal, state, and private grants, you may also be eligible for scholarships we provide qualified students directly from NBSS. Here are just a few, and all you need to be considered for these is complete the FAFSA.
