Community Builder and Leader of Visionary Public Spaces to Address Graduates at America's First Trade School

Boston MA, June 2, 2023—North Bennet Street School is proud to announce Chris Cook, Executive Director of The Rose F. Kennedy Greenway Conservancy, as the keynote speaker for its 2023 Commencement Ceremony. The ceremony will take place on June 2, 2023, at the historic Old North Church in Boston's North End neighborhood.

Cook has been instrumental in building strategies and programs for the contemporary public park in the heart of Boston. Under his leadership the last two years, The Greenway has been a life force for the City, helping to beautify the downtown, foster community, and create opportunity through its engaging landscapes, public art projects, artisan markets, food trucks, special events, and more. Today, The Greenway welcomes millions of visitors annually to explore, gather, play, and unwind.

"Chris Cook is a thoughtful visionary leader with a transformative impact on the city of Boston," said NBSS President Sarah Turner. "His commitment to access, collaboration, and community engagement embodies the values that we instill in our students at North Bennet Street School. Particularly now, The Greenway is a prime example of how Boston can rethink and re-open access and energy in the center of the City. In addition to his work at The Greenway, Cook brings a wealth of experience in community building and public service to his role as Commencement Speaker. He previously served as Chief of Environment, Energy and Open Space for the City of Boston and worked on educational initiatives for Boston Public Schools.

"I am honored to address the graduates of North Bennet Street School, an institution that has played a vital role in preserving and promoting traditional crafts for over a century," said Cook. "As we look to the future, we must continue to support the arts and the skilled trades, which are essential to our cultural and economic vitality. It is a critical time to support organizations like North Bennet, whose graduates are crucial to creating a sense of connection within our communities."

The School's 2023 Commencement will see a cohort of nearly 100 new crafts- and tradespeople join a community of over 3,0000 NBSS alumni located around the world. The event is closed to the public, but a livestream will be available via YouTube.

As America's first trade school, North Bennet Street School is internationally known for its programs that help students to achieve meaningful lives and livelihoods. For more than a century, the exceptional programs, expert faculty, and inspiring community have encouraged individual growth, curiosity, technical mastery, and commitment to excellence.



The School offers career training programs in Bookbinding, Carpentry, Cabinet & Furniture Making, Jewelry Making & Repair, Locksmithing & Security Technology, Piano Technology, Preservation Carpentry, and Violin Making & Repair. NBSS additionally provides over 120 short, craft- and trade-based classes to beginners and more advanced students every year. The School is committed to community engagement, with offerings that range from career discovery programs for youth, to preservation projects with civic partners, to virtual programming and exhibitions for the public at large.

From its founding as a settlement house for immigrants in 1881, the School has trained individuals of all backgrounds from its home within Boston's culturally rich North End neighborhood. In 2013, NBSS moved to an impressive, 64,000-square-foot facility—an award-winning adaptive reuse project that transformed a former police station and the City of Boston's printing plant. The School will celebrate a decade in their "new" building this fall.
