NBSS offers nine career training programs across a range of crafts and trades. In addition, the School provides 180+ short classes each year, welcoming students of all skill levels to explore their chosen discipline.

Founded in 1881 as a settlement house for immigrants, NBSS has a long history of providing transformative education and training to individuals from all backgrounds. The School remains committed to community engagement and regularly develops youth programs, educational partnerships, preservation projects, exhibitions, and a range of public events.

- Bookbinding: Creating, restoring, and preserving books and archival materials
- Carpentry: Residential construction and renovation with a focus on hand and machine tool use
- Cabinet & Furniture Making: Woodworking rooted in traditional design and joinery techniques
- Jewelry Making & Repair: Fabricating and repairing jewelry using classic and modern methods
- Locksmithing & Security Technology: Mechanical and electronic access systems for home and commercial use
- Piano Technology (Basic & Advanced): Tuning, maintaining, restoring, and rebuilding pianos
- Preservation Carpentry: Repairing and replicating architectural elements in historic buildings
- Violin Making & Repair: Making and maintaining bowed string instruments to the highest standards
- Community Education: Short-term classes that broaden interest and access while developing hands-on skills

NBSS students come from around the world and reflect a wide range of backgrounds: career changers and veterans, artists and engineers, office professionals and tradespeople, high school graduates and those with advanced degrees.
