

HISTORY

NBSS was founded in 1881 as North Bennet Street Industrial School. Our original objective was to assist immigrants as they adjusted to their new country by providing the training needed for gainful employment.

Pauline Agassiz Shaw, the School's founder, was committed to teaching a wide variety of skills and providing social services to the community. Vocational training classes were offered in pottery, printing, sewing, sheet-metal work, and watch repair as well as the carpentry, cabinet making, and jewelry making classes that continue today.

PHILOSOPHY

From the start, NBSS implemented a Swedish system of craftsmanship training known as "Sloyd." This method focuses on the development of character, intellect, and hand skills—including an understanding of tools, materials, and processes. Ultimately, the method seeks to teach the "whole person" how to make a living and how to lead a fuller life. Today, the philosophy of Sloyd remains at the heart of the School.

MISSION

Our mission is to train students for careers in traditional trades that use hand skills in concert with evolving technology, to preserve and advance craft traditions, and to promote greater appreciation of craftsmanship.

- Violin Making & Repair


Our faculty are highly experienced professionals, who instill in students a sense of care and a commitment to excellence.
